Reasons to support ZANE


- ZANE** builds a personal relationship with every one of the 2,600 elderly, often very lonely, people to whom we give aid, support and encouragement. Only those really in need of assistance receive it.
- ZANE** provides the largest social services network in Zimbabwe.
- Donors are able to choose which aspect of **ZANE's** mission they plan to support.
- Recently **ZANE** was the Telegraph Group Overseas Charity of the year.
- ZANE** is looking after over 600 aged and frail veterans who fought for the Crown in WW2 Malaya, Korea, Aden. Despite their loyal service to the UK the overwhelming majority are living with insufficient food and no healthcare cover whatsoever.
- ZANE** runs training initiatives and supplies seed-funding to enable self-help businesses and food production in impoverished communities in Zimbabwe.
- ZANE** funded the first clubfoot correction programme in Zimbabwe. Eleven treatment centres have been established and over 2,200 children have received treatment to date.
- ZANE** receives no aid from the government and relies wholly on support from private donors.
- An independent consultancy reviewed **ZANE** and the report stated: "The charity thrives on its responsiveness, flexibility and lack of bureaucracy. Operationally **ZANE** is frugal, focused and effective in delivering aid to the needy."



Dear Reader

Just when you might have thought we had walked our last step, Jane and I, along with Moses the dog, have decided to embark on yet another walk across England, all because of your generous sponsorship over the past seven years.

Take a look at what you have achieved:

- Countless lives have been saved across Zimbabwe
- Food is now in the cupboards of destitute pensioners
- Life-saving medication has reached those suffering in pain and dying in misery
- Two thousand two hundred children with clubfoot are now freed from their appalling misery and can jump for joy
- Comfort and hope has been brought to thousands of Zimbabweans who otherwise would have been forgotten.

We must walk again as countless others still depend on ZANE and there are many others in desperate need of our help.

We must walk to help those too weak and impoverished to help themselves.

A comment made by a colleague of mine in Zimbabwe recently really struck home to me: "Zimbabwe is a victim; a victim of political violence, a victim of farm seizures, a victim of corruption, a victim of mass murder, a victim of human rights violations - an innocent victim. Zimbabwe needs to be proud again."

So you see it's not just the innocent people of Zimbabwe who are the victims; the nation as a whole has been blighted. The farmland once lush and productive is today barren and unutilized;

manufacturing and industry have been beaten down; today hospitals are unable to function properly; tourism is a distant memory - the list goes on.

Thirty-seven years after independence, almost half of the population requires food aid. With most civil servants earning just \$300 a month, it's not hard to see why. Hope has gone and there is a greater sense of uncertainty. Crime is rising as desperation and cash shortages increase - the country is running out of money yet again. The fear facing the frail and lonely, elderly people and the war veterans - all supported by ZANE - is hard to imagine.

Our staff report increasingly harrowing cases - hunger is everywhere, hardship and untreated illness are commonplace and the level of need is overwhelming.

So we walk to help the poorest of the poor and for those who would otherwise be forgotten.

Sponsorship will keep someone alive.

You can bring aid and comfort to those who need it most. People like Bernard and Molly.



An Uncertain Future

Instead of enjoying their twilight years in comfort and security, Bernard and Molly* are struggling to survive and facing an uncertain future.

Having served in the Army for a number of years, Bernard subsequently worked as a prison officer until he was laid off in early 2001. Using his creative skills and passion for wood work, Bernard managed to earn a modest living to support his family. His wife Molly cared for their only son who was left with learning disabilities after contracting meningitis as a baby. Molly later worked at a children's crèche.

In an all too familiar tale in Zimbabwe, everything changed overnight when the family lost their savings in the record-breaking hyper-inflation. Around the same time Molly began to lose her sight.

The family struggled on until poor health meant neither could continue to work. Bernard receives a small government

pension but this is frequently paid 2-3 weeks late. They rely on the salary of their son who is paid \$250 a month working as a labourer six days a week. Molly is now completely blind and Bernard who is battling cancer struggles to care for her. A recent attempted break in at their home has left both with heightened anxiety.

ZANE assists them with a monthly grant and provides them with e'Pap - a nutritional food supplement to help keep their strength up. "ZANE has improved our lives and we are so grateful. We have no luxury items but are still barely



surviving. When the electricity runs out, we cook outside on a fire. We used to keep chickens but it became too much. Now we just sit and listen to the radio. It brightens our day when Sally* from ZANE visits to deliver our grant - she is a ray of light and we so appreciate her compassion and kindness. Thank you for not forgetting us."

Sadly we have just been notified of Bernard's death, leading to an ever more uncertain future for Molly and her son.
