The Hon Tendai Biti

Tendai Biti is a lawyer with a vast range of experience including 18 years' service at Zimbabwe's oldest law firm, Honey and Blanckenberg. In 1999, Biti was part of the founding team of the Movement for Democratic Change (MDC). He joined the Government as Minister of Finance in February 2009.

On the 18th of November 2013 he established his own firm, Tendai Biti Law, and is the senior partner. This firm specialises in international finance as well as domestic constitutional issues.

Mr Biti was elected as the president of the new People's Democratic Party in September 2015.



Senator David Coltart

David Coltart is a human rights lawyer in Zimbabwe. He was the founding member of the MDC and its founding Secretary for Legal Affairs.

He was the Member of Parliament for Bulawayo South in the House of Assembly from 2000 to 2008 when he was elected to the Senate. He is the Legal Secretary of the Movement for Democratic Change and Senior Partner of Bulawayo law firm, Webb, Llow and Barry. He was the Minister for Education, Sport, Arts and Culture in the Zimbabwean inclusive transitional government from February 2009 until August 2013.

In 2016 Coltart published "The Struggle Continues : 50 Years of Tyranny", which was launched in London last November.



Gradualia

Gradualia is a vocal consort specialising in the music of the Renaissance period. The group was founded in October 2001 in order to explore the vocal repertoire of the 15th - early 17th centuries. The name is taken from William Byrd's two volume cycle of "Propers" for use with the Mass throughout the Church year.

ZANE: Zimbabwe A National Emergency

ZANE is a UK registered charity working to help the most destitute, vulnerable and impoverished people in Zimbabwe. In addition to providing financial aid, food and comfort to around 2,600 destitute pensioners, ZANE funds a clubfoot correction programme, supports vulnerable women and children living in extreme poverty and provides prosthetic limbs for victims of land mine explosions.
