### **REASONS TO SUPPORT ZANE**

- ZANE provides aid, comfort and support to 1,800 impoverished pensioners with nowhere else to turn. Only those genuinely in need of assistance receive it.
- 2. Donors can choose which area of ZANE's work they wish to support.





# CARING FOR OTHERS

Joan\*, 79, spent her entire life caring for others. She worked as a matron in care homes for the elderly until ill health forced her to retire. Always a keen walker, Joan was recently dealt a very cruel blow when she was forced to have her foot amputated. Joan had been experiencing diabetes-related infections for some years but sadly nothing could be done to save her foot.

Having led such an active life, this is taking a lot of adjustment. No longer able to live on her own, Joan has moved to a frail-care home - ironically round the corner from where she worked as a matron for so many years.



"It has been a terrifying time and I miss my independence so much."
Yet, without ZANE it would be so much worse. The care home fees are much greater than the rent on her cottage but thanks to the generosity of ZANE's supporters
Joan is able to receive the
