Whilst little has changed over the past year for those assisted by ZANE in Zimbabwe, their hearts remain full of gratitude and hope – gratitude that the aid has continued, and hope that it will continue still.

ZANE is only able to offer hope and receive such heartfelt gratitude because of the kindness and loyalty of you, ZANE's supporters.

Twenty-one years on, the crisis in Zimbabwe continues. The emergency that ZANE first responded to will undoubtedly persist into the foreseeable future. Each time the Zimbabwean currency fails,

people's savings are wiped out. In February 2009, all bank accounts in the country were again reduced to zero, erasing savings and pensions alike.

After each currency collapse, those who can still work may find new employment if they are lucky, but the elderly are left without savings and with no means of earning an income these are the people who ZANE steps in to help. Sadly, with salaries failing to keep up with the cost of living, many reach retirement with no pension, little or no savings, and no government social care. As the country spirals into ever-greater poverty, ZANE's services remain crucial.

ZANE continues to provide food, medicine and shelter to thousands of impoverished pensioners. It also offers vital education and food to children who would otherwise go without. We have successfully treated the clubfoot of more than 6,600 youngsters, totally transforming their lives.

This would not be possible without the unstinting kindness of our supporters, who continue to respond to ZANE's appeals with remarkable generosity. That generosity is saving and enhancing lives. Please read on to discover the difference your support is making.

How to Donate to ZANE

There are many ways to donate to ZANE online, by cheque or by bank transfer. You can also set up a **Direct Debit** to provide a monthly, quarterly or annual donation. **Regular gifts** help us to plan ZANE's work because it means we can predict how much income we'll have in the future. It helps us to know, day in and day out, that we will have a steady income stream to rely on. It also allows you to plan your giving and provides you with the flexibility to change it at any time. If you already provide a regular gift, thank you. If you would like to set up a regular payment, please complete and return the direct debit form on the back page of this newsletter.

As a ZANE supporter, you can make your generous donation go even further by completing the **Gift Aid** declaration. This allows ZANE to claim back an extra 25p for every £1 you donate, at no additional cost to you. If you are a higher rate taxpayer, then you will even receive some money back from HMRC! If you have paid more income tax in the UK than we will reclaim on your donation, then you are eligible.

This includes tax on salaries, pensions, dividends and interest – so more people are eligible than you might think. Your support can make a significant difference, helping us to reach even more people in need.

Did you know that if you leave a **legacy** to a charity in your will, that gift is not subject to inheritance tax and could reduce the taxable value of your estate? In addition, if you leave more than 10% of the total of your estate to charity, your inheritance tax rate will be reduced from 40% to 36%, which is a significant saving. If you are considering leaving ZANE a gift in your will, thank you. It will be remembered for generations to come.

A Lifetime Dedicated to Others

Bella, 86, worked as a nurse in a government hospital for more than 50 years. It was a career worthy of a comfortable pension, but her savings were sadly wiped out during the bout of record-breaking hyperinflation – yet another victim of Zimbabwe's economic catastrophe.

Bella never married, instead dedicating her life to her work and immersing herself in community life. She was very close to her sister and brother-in-law and was heartbroken when her sister died four years ago. When her brother-in-law later moved to South Africa, she sadly lost touch with him. Reluctant to ask for assistance — and insistent that others were worse off than she — Bella pretended that all was fine. Always beautifully dressed (her sister was a seamstress), she put on a facade of coping and doing well.



It was only when Bella collapsed at the local pharmacy last year that her circumstances became apparent. She was malnourished and anaemic – her funds had run dry but she was too proud to ask for help.

ZANE now covers Bella's bills and medical costs and provides her with a regular food parcel. This has given her a new lease of life, and she has joined her local WI group and taken up knitting again.

"I've always been the one helping others; I was too proud to ask for help. I'm so grateful that strangers in the UK care enough to help old folk like me, thousands of miles away. It really is heartwarming. Thank you."



The Forgotten Legion

ZANE works in partnership with UK services charities to distribute welfare grants to around 440 war veterans and their widows in Zimbabwe. These veterans are part of the "Forgotten Legion" – veterans who served in the British Armed Forces prior to their country gaining independence.

The grants they receive provide the equivalent of two nutritious meals a day. Without this support, they would simply not have enough to eat. In addition, ZANE funds medical assistance for these veterans and their widows, treating conditions such as hypertension, diabetes and arthritis.

Both the food grants and medical provision have greatly enhanced their wellbeing and health. The mortality rate has declined, as deadly conditions such as hypertension are now treated.

Each of the veterans and widows we support is individually known to our team, who frequently check on their wellbeing. Many of them are supporting orphaned grandchildren whose parents died from HIV. The surviving veterans are now mostly in their 90s and becoming increasingly frail. They include Marufu, who served the Crown

in the Rhodesian services during the Malayan conflict. Like many of Zimbabwe's pensioners, he lost his savings when Zimbabwe's government lost control of the economy. Through no fault of his own, he was rendered wholly destitute. Marufu lives with hypertension and Type 2 diabetes, and ZANE covers the cost of his essential medication.



"ZANE saved my life," Marufu told us recently.
"I'm so grateful – thank you."

Veterans like Marufu came to the UK's aid when we needed them most; it is now our duty to help them in the evening of their lives.

employment opportunities and recurrent climate-related shocks all contribute to food insecurity. Malnutrition remains a significant public health concern, increasing the overall disease burden and impeding child development.

Providing food to some of the most impoverished people in Zimbabwe is at the heart of ZANE's work. ZANE does not distribute bulk food aid; every beneficiary of the food programme is personally known to us. It is a small-scale initiative with a big impact.

Care Homes

ZANE provides a weekly supply of fresh fruit, vegetables, meat and eggs to 26 care homes in Zimbabwe. Some also receive rice, pasta and lentils. This benefits more than 700 pensioners and contributes significantly to ensuring residents receive three nutritious meals a day.

ZANE works with local farms and suppliers, supporting family-run businesses. The weekly deliveries start at 6am with a large truck bringing fruit and vegetables, alongside separate

deliveries of meat and eggs. Food is delivered to a central point, with a representative from each home collecting their supply. Our team delivers to those unable to collect, as well as to those in the Eastern Highlands. It is a highly efficient and effective system.

Annual provision includes:

- 259,200 eggs one egg a day for each resident, an excellent source of protein
- 16,208 kg of meat
- 36,400 bananas
- 4,640 cauliflowers
- **5,920** cabbages
- Approx **45,000 onions**





Food Parcels

ZANE also provides regular food boxes to 215 destitute pensioners living in their own homes. These boxes contain cooking oil, rice, sugar, tinned fish, tinned vegetables, juice, toilet roll, tea, coffee, biscuits, and fresh fruit and vegetables. Additional donations of lentils, chocolate and other treats are often included throughout the year. These boxes are lifesaving for most recipients.

"Without the food box, I would not be able to get through the month. I feel so much better now I can eat more frequently – the hunger pain has lessened. Thank you."

Pop-up Classes


The 72 children attending our pop-up classes in a high-density community receive nutritional porridge at the start of each day – a nutrient-dense food packed with vitamins and minerals. This sets them up for the morning, easing hunger pains and aiding concentration. At lunch, each child and teaching mentor receives a hot meal of kapenta (dried fish), mealie meal, soy chunks, peanut butter and vegetables. The vegetables are grown by the children and mentors in the local community. For most of these children, all of

whom live in extreme poverty, this is their only meal of the day.

In addition, ZANE provides monthly dried food packs and fresh vegetables to several families from the same local community. These families all have children attending the pop-up classes and are otherwise entirely destitute. Each family is well known to our small team; we have built relationships with them over a long period.



Nutritional porridge is also distributed to pensioners, veterans and their widows, and orphans (from a high-density community in Bulawayo), reaching more than 1,200 impoverished individuals.


For the elderly, your donations provide dignity and comfort. Your support sends a message of hope – their plight is understood and they have not been forgotten.

- 3,270 visits to pensioners in their own homes and care homes by ZANE field workers.
- More than 10,000 hot meals provided to children attending our pop-up classes.
- Life-saving medicine given to hundreds of pensioners, including hypertension treatment for 252 people.
- Successful clubfoot treatment for more than 640 children.
- Rent assistance provided to 230 pensioners living in their own homes.
- More than 4,000 heads of broccoli delivered to pensioners living in care homes.

Now, thanks to ZANE, I have hope

Len, 71, is a retired art teacher and talented artist. He stopped working 14 years ago and, leaving behind his friends and support network, moved to the Eastern Highlands to care for his elderly father. Len struggled after his father died, having spent all his money on his care. Living alone in his late father's rural house - which was dilapidated and in desperate need of repair – he became increasingly isolated and sank into

depression. Neglecting his personal needs and hygiene, Len ended up living in squalor.

Earlier this year, a concerned neighbour contacted ZANE for help. Our team was shocked by Len's condition. He had an advanced bacterial infection caused by poor circulation and we were distressed to discover that maggots were eating the flesh of his legs. ZANE arranged for Len to be admitted to hospital but the infection was too advanced, and sadly, both of his legs had to be amputated.


After a lengthy hospital stay, Len is now recovering in the frail care unit of a residential care home. His wounds are healing and he is responding well to physiotherapy. Len had also been struggling to see clearly but after two cataract operations, his eyesight has dramatically improved. He can now read and is slowly starting to paint again.

Len's story is a sad one and indicative of how inadequate welfare and social care provision in Zimbabwe leaves people falling through the cracks.

> Thankfully, ZANE was able to intervene due to the kindness of our supporters. Without ZANE, Len would have faced a lonely and excruciating death. Instead, he is now pain-free, well cared for and has rediscovered his passion for painting.

The cataract operation has changed my life - to be able to see again, well enough to paint, is such a blessing. Thank you."

Reasons to Support ZANE

- ZANE provides aid, comfort and support to 2,100 impoverished pensioners with nowhere else to turn.
 Only those genuinely in need of assistance receive it.
- 2. Donors can choose which area of ZANE's work they wish to support.
- 3. ZANE was the Telegraph Group Overseas Charity of the year.
- 4. ZANE is looking after over 440 aged and frail veterans and their widows. These people fought for the Crown in WW2, Malaya, Korea and Aden. Without ZANE, they would be living with insufficient food and no healthcare.
- ZANE runs education programmes in the highdensity areas assisting women and children living in extreme poverty.
- ZANE funded the first clubfoot correction programme in Zimbabwe. Fifteen treatment centres

- have been established and over 6,600 children have received treatment to date.
- 7. ZANE runs a unique medical programme, providing basic medication to pensioners (including war veterans and their widows) for the treatment of conditions such as hypertension, diabetes and prostate issues.
